

TLC/ELCA Study Team Update...

Our Study Team has had two very special experiences through the past two weeks, as we are now intentionally exploring the ministries and positions of the North American Lutheran Church (NALC).

On Saturday, October 12, a group of parishioners left home at 6:00 am and traveled to St Paul's (NALC) Lutheran Church, Sarver, PA, to attend the annual convocation of the NALC's Mid-Atlantic Mission District (the NALC's version of an ELCA Synod Assembly). The day began with worship (using the red ELW hymnal which we use at Trinity). We were privileged to meet The Rev. Dr. Dan Selbo, the newly-elected Bishop of the NALC, who was the preacher and special presenter at the event. We learned about the NALC's 4 core values: "Christ-Centered, Mission-Driven, Traditionally-Grounded, and Congregationally-Focused". We heard about growth in discipleship and mission, and a clear emphasis on Biblical teaching, preaching, and learning. Noticeably absent was acrimony, division, or social/political/economic stresses. There was a clear sense of unity of purpose and cooperation, as the event was marked by a refreshing fellowship of Christians, committed to working together, and to growing and sharing the Faith and Love of the Church.

While there are some who suggest the NALC is "anti-gay/lesbian", exclusionary, and intentionally condemning of members, families, and friends of the LBTQ+ community, we learned and experienced that, without a doubt, this is NOT a true or fair depiction. While the NALC holds to and practices the Biblical and Confessional witness that Christian marriage is given to us as a gift from God which unites a man and a woman in a life-long union of mutual love, fidelity, and

perpetuity, the NALC welcomes ALL people into her fellowship. The NALC consistently and clearly acknowledges that ours is not to judge a brother or sister. ALL people are fallen and, by God's love, are called to live by His grace, thankful for the redeeming life, death, and resurrection of His Son, Jesus Christ. We all stand as saint and sinner, forgiven and loved, and called from death to life.

Then, on Monday evening, October 14, our Study Team welcomed Pr Nila Cogan, Pastor of St Thomas (NALC) Lutheran Church, Hooversville PA, a group of 4 council members from her congregation, and a group of 3 council members from Holy Trinity (NALC) Lutheran Church, Berlin, PA.

We broke into small groups, asked questions about parish life and ministries, listened to their past and recent experiences in transitioning from the ELCA to the NALC. We talked about the current challenges and joys which they share. As we did, we met and experienced 2 congregations which talked about experiencing personal growth in discipleship, in clarity of mission, in their faith-formation, and the building up of the membership of their congregations. Pr Nila was especially helpful in describing the NALC's denominational structure, some of the special emphases of the NALC, and the resources and support which is shared among NALC congregations, which we'll highlight at the Special Sunday Morning Update on 10/27; 9:45 am. These discussions, based on the real-life experiences of congregations, council members, parishioners and a pastor serving in the NALC, provided informative and helpful information.

We continue to appreciate the interest which so many parishioners are sharing with the Study Team's work, and the questions, concerns, and encouragement which we've received. We encourage parishioners and friends to visit the NALC's website, check out their ministries, practices, and positions.

Please continue to keep us in your prayers! And, remember to attend the special Update Event, on Sunday, October 27; at 9:45 am.
